

Ways to Bank




There are different ways you can use your bank account with Nationwide.



If you have the Nationwide banking app on your phone, you can use the app to:

- check how much money is in your account
- see what you have spent
- see what you have been paid
- make and change payments
- stop anyone using your card
- order a new card.



Internet banking

If you sign up for internet banking, you can go on the internet to:

- check how much money is in your account
- get a statement to show the payments in to and out of your account
- make and change payments
- talk to someone on our chat
- update your personal details like your address or phone number.







In one of our Nationwide branches

You can find your local branch of Nationwide on our branch finder.



If you go to a Nationwide branch, you can:

- take money out of your account
- pay cash in to your account
- pay cheques in to your account.

Telephone banking

You can set up telephone banking on the phone, or in a branch.



If you set up telephone banking, you can use a phone to:

- check how much money is in your account
- see what you have spent
- see what you have been paid.





Cash machines

Some Nationwide cash machines are inside a Nationwide branch.



Some Nationwide cash machines are on the outside wall of a Nationwide branch.



You can use a Nationwide cash machine to:

- check how much money is in your account
- take money out of your account
- pay cash in to your account
- pay cheques in to your account
- pay bills
- transfer money
- change or unlock your PIN
 Your PIN is a number you
 sometimes have to use with your
 bank card.
- see the last few payments in to or out of your account. This is called a mini statement. You can also print the mini statement.







You can take money out at any cash machine. It does not have to be a Nationwide cash machine.



If you take money out at a cash machine which is not a Nationwide cash machine, you might have to pay extra money from your account to take the money out.
